## Introduction to the Isle of Man

**Tuesdays, 6pm-7:50pm**

This course provides a broad introduction to Manx history and heritage. It covers a wide variety of topics, including the geology and archaeology of the Island; its social, economic, and political history; its built and natural environments; and its language, literature, music, and folklore. Each session will be taught by a lecturer who is a specialist in that area.

The course forms part UCM's BA (Hons) History & Heritage, but is offered here as an independent course. It can be taken for credit (20 credits at Level 4 from the University of Chester) or for interest only. All applicants who wish to take this course for credit will be asked to submit a copy of their CV, or a personal statement
